

Governor Beaver's Inauguration.

The inauguration of Governor Beaver yesterday was an event worthy of a great state like Pennsylvania.

Another amendment providing for an extension of six months after the passage of the bill of the time for the redemption was carried.

The boom for Governor Hill for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1888 received a marked impetus at the meeting of the Indiana Democratic Editorial Association in Indianapolis last Friday.

A BILL was passed in the House yesterday, providing that there shall be at the seat of government an executive department to be known as the department of agriculture and labor under the control of a secretary of agriculture and labor and an assistant secretary.
