Republican Primary Election.

Pursuant to a Resolution of the County Committee, passed February 23rd, it is ordered that the Republican voters of Forest meet on

SATURDAY, JUNE 7th, 1890,

at 2 o'clock p. m. at the following named places of holding Primary elections to-wit: Barnum, Jacob Maze's Carpenter Shop, Barnett, Haling's, Joseph Husing's Shop, Green, Upper, at Galton School House, Green, Lower, at Nebraska, Forest House, Green, at Bowman's Mill, Harmony, Upper, at Fleming Hill, Harmony, Lower, at Allender School House, Harmony, at West Hickory, Hickory, at East Hickory, Jenks, Central, Marienville, Jenks, Southern, GHFyle, Jenks, those living at Clough's Mills and vicinity, at Clough's Mills, Jenks, at Brown's Mill, Kingsley, Newtown, Kingsley, White Hill School House, Kingsley, Starr School House, Howe, East, Brookston, Howe, West, Balltown, Howe, Middle, Cooper Tract, Howe, Etulalla, at office of Peter Mahoney, Tionesta Township, Court House, Tionesta twp., voters in vicinity of school house at B. T. Mealy's said school house, Borough, Court House.

Each Election Precinct will also elect one person for the County Committee for the ensuing year.

The polls will remain open until 7 p. m.

Return Judges will convene at the Court House, Tionesta Borough, on the following Tuesday, June 10, at 2 o'clock p. m.

Attention is called to the Act of June, 1881, regulating Primary Elections, that Judges and Clerks, before entering upon the discharge of their duties shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation in presence of each other, viz:

"I do solemnly swear (or swear) that I will as Judge, Inspector or Clerk (as the case may be) at the ensuing election impartially and faithfully perform my duties in accordance with the laws and constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the Republican party of the County of Forest, for the government of said primary elections, meeting or caucus, to the best of my judgment and ability."

These oaths or affirmations to be first administered to the Judge or Inspector, then the Judge can qualify the other Clerks or administrator the oath to any elector offering to vote. The above form is given for convenience and is that prescribed by the Act aforesaid. And all who qualify should observe it closely, that the election may be conducted according to Rules of the Republican party in this County, and law governing primaries.

Republican Primary Rules.

RULES GOVERNING THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY ELECTIONS OF FOREST COUNTY.

1. The candidates for the several offices shall have their names announced in one or more of the county papers at least three weeks previous to the Primary Meetings stating their names, and subject to the action of the party at the said primary meetings.
2. The voters belonging to the Republican party in each township and borough, shall meet on a day to be designated by the County Committee at the usual place of holding spring elections, at 2 o'clock P. M., and proceed to elect one person for Judge, and two persons for Clerks who shall form a Board of Elections to receive votes and determine who are the proper persons to vote, and who shall hold the polls open until 7 o'clock P. M. After the polls are opened, the candidates announced shall be balloted for; the name of each person voting shall be written on a list at the time of voting, no person being allowed to vote more than once for the same office.
3. After the polls are closed the board shall proceed to count the votes that each candidate has received, and make out the returns accordingly, to be certified by the Judge and attested by the Clerks.
4. The Judge (or one of the Clerks appointed by the Judge) of the respective election district, shall meet at the Court House, in Tionesta, on the Tuesday following the Primary Meetings at 2 o'clock P. M., having the returns and a list of voters, and the person having the highest number of votes for any office, shall be declared the nominee for the Republican party.
5. The Return Judges shall be competent to reject by a majority, the returns from any district where there is evidence of fraud, either in the returns or otherwise, and shall reject them where there is evidence of three or more persons voting at the Primary Meeting who are not Republicans.
6. Any two or more persons having an equal number of votes for the same office, the Judges shall proceed to ballot for a choice, in Tionesta, on the Tuesday following the Primary Meetings at 2 o'clock P. M., having the returns and a list of voters, and the person having the highest number of votes to be the nominee.
7. The Return Judges shall appoint Comptrollers—Representative, Senatorial and Congressional—whose acceptance of said appointment shall be a pledge to support the person who may receive the largest number of votes cast for that office.
8. The Return Judges may at any time change the mode and manner of selecting candidates as they may be instructed by the people at their primary meetings, due notice being given by the County Committee.
9. The Chairman of the County Committee shall be required to issue a call in pursuance of the action of the County Committee.
