THE CHILIAN EMBROGLIO.

President Harrison's message on the of Congress Monday. It is couched in language dignified and firm, and goes straight to the matter at issue. Its very brevity gives it force, and from the facts so saliently presented the people can see the situation which confronts the Nation. The time when further delay cannot honorably be tolthis country must. As summarized in the ultimatum sent to Chili last week, nent cure in a very short time. 25 and 50 the President's conclusions are that hostility to this government, and no act of the sailors themselves, led to the assault and murder; that the public authorities of Valparaiso not only failed to protect our sailors, but that Chilian police and soldiers participated in the assaults upon them, both before and after arrest, the inherent probabilities being that one soilor was killed by police or soldiers, and, therefore, the President asks "for a suitable apology and some adequate reparation for the injury done this government."

The President impresses upon Congress that the dignity and influence of the United States require the enforcement of these just demands. While desiring peace, coveting no territorial aggrandizement, and extending the utmost forbearance to weaker powers, the Nation must at all times stand ready to maintain its honor and adequately protect its numblest citizen.

This is the situation. That it is a grave one, there is no longer room to doubt. Nor can it be doubted that the people, irrespective of party, will ustain the President in the firm and dignified position he has taken. Chili must come to terms or prepare for trouble.

CHILI BACKS DOWN.

A late dispatch from Chili states, in effect, that Chili agrees to withdraw the offensive note sent by Seno Matta to all the Chilian Ministers abroad, and acknowledges that its issuance was due to an error of judgment. Chili also withdraws its request for the withdrawal of United States Minister

In addition to this the Chilian Government, in answer, proposes that the affair of the attack on the Baltimore's sailors in Valparaiso be submitted to to the arbitration of some neutral nation. If this proposition is not acceptable to the United States Government, the Chilian Government suggests that the matter be submitted to the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States.

THE death of Justice Joseph P. Bradley, of the United States Supreme Court, occurred in Washington on Friday last, and removes from the bench one of the oldest, in point of years, as well as one of the ablest of the eminent jurists from that exalted position. He was aged nearly 79 years, and has occupied the bench since March, 1870, when President Grant oppointed him to the place, his residence then being New Jersey. Chief Justice Paxton and Judge Mitchell of the Supreme Court of this state have already been favorably mentioned for the vacancy.


