Last Thursday was Pennsylvania day at the World's Fair, and the old Keystone State showed Chicago people something.

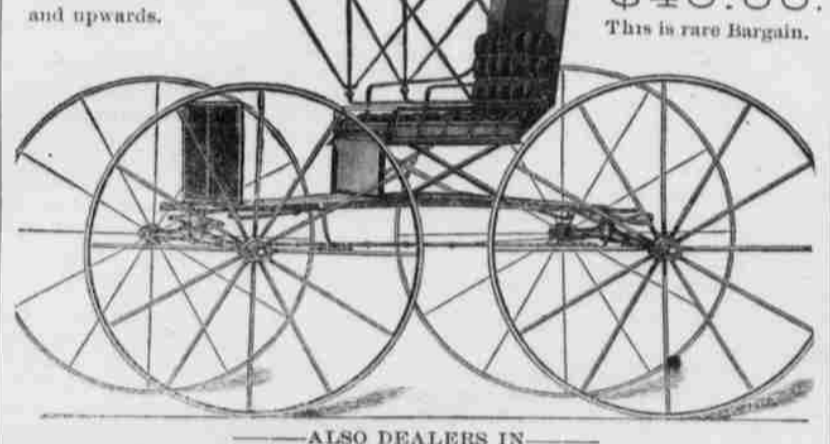

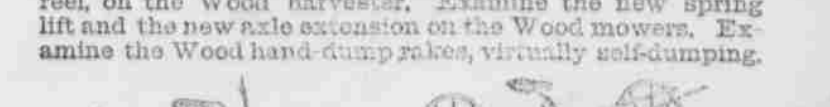
