

THE GREAT REPUBLICAN LANDSLIDE.

As the Official Returns Come in the Victory Becomes More Pronounced.

PENNSYLVANIA. The Republican majority in Pennsylvania is still growing, and when all the official figures are in they will show a majority of nearly 139,000.

NEW YORK. The official figures make the majority of Palmer, Republican candidate for Secretary of State, over Meyer, Democrat, 24,768, and Bartlett, Republican, for Judge of the Court of Appeals, over Maynard, Democrat, 100,146.

OHIO. The official returns are in from four-fifths of the 88 counties in Ohio, and with the unofficial figures from the remaining counties Gov. McKinley's plurality is placed at 83,791, and his majority over all at 30,000.

COLORADO. Complete returns from the interior of the State clearly demonstrate that the People's party is no longer a factor in Colorado politics and the Republican party is once more in control.

IOWA. The official figures will undoubtedly give Jackson, Rep., over Boies, Dem., for Governor, a majority of 35,000, which will be increased to 40,000 on the balance of the State ticket, as Jackson runs behind his ticket about four to a precinct.

MASSACHUSETTS. The Republicans have swept the State as clean as they used to do twenty years ago before anything like a formidable opposition had arisen to dispute their political supremacy.

NEW JERSEY. The Republicans have captured both houses of the State legislature in New Jersey by good majorities, and it may be set down as foregone that some of the horrible laws passed by the Democrats in the past few years will have to go.

NEBRASKA. Official returns from 77 out of the 90 counties in Nebraska give Harrison, Republican candidate for Supreme Judge, 61,962 and Holcomb, Populist, 53,530.

KANSAS. The same story of great victories for the Republicans is applicable to the vote in Kansas, where the Populist is wont to bloom and flourish.

That big striped beast, the Tammany tiger, got many additional stripes on Tuesday, well laid on. Think of it! Brooklyn carried by the Republicans and Independent Democrats.
