On Trial For His Life.

Yesterday morning the trial of Joseph Ochinski, for the murder of Charles Reimer at Brookston, on the 15th of October, was begun.

The forenoon was taken up in the selection of a jury. The Commonwealth is represented by District Attorney Clark, and Hon. O. C. Allen of Warren; T. F. Ritchey Esq. is defending the prisoner. Hugo Reimer, son of deceased, is the prosecutor. The jurors are, Thomas Armstrong, Jenks; James Black, Tionesta twp.; James D. Davis, Tionesta boro; Adam Emert, Hickory twp.; Aaron Fenstermaker, Tionesta twp.; John R. Flynn Kingsley; Wm. Hartman, Kingsley; Kennedy Haugh, Green; H. W. Ledebur, Green; H. C. Parker, Harmony; Joseph Swab, Hickory twp.; W. F. Doubles, Kingsley. The case will doubtless occupy the whole of to-day. All other jurors for this term have been excused.

—A very distressing accident happened to Jimmie, the 6-year-old son of Z. T. Shriver last Saturday evening, by which the little fellow will in all probability lose the sight of an eye. He was at play with some of his little companions and they were throwing and batting glass bottles. James struck a bottle and when it burst a piece struck him on the outer corner of the eye-ball, cutting a deep gash in the same. He was taken to an Oil City oculist immediately, but what the result has been we have not learned.

—A postmaster pointing to three or four letters held for postage said: "Any man is liable to put a letter in the postoffice without stamping it. With a card on the corner of the envelope we can stamp it and collect the postage when the writers come in. We don't know who dropped those letters into the box and must hold them until we write to the person addressed and they send us the postage. That is the rule of the postoffice department. Every writer of a letter ought to have his name printed or stamped on the envelope."

—Judah Ann, wife of our old friend Noah K. Burton, of Marienville, died on the 10th inst., at the advanced age of 81 years. Upward of forty years ago she came with her husband from York State and located at their present place of residence. —The forthcoming report of the superintendent of public instruction will be taken in order to determine how many children are not attending school who ought to be. He will show that the increased state appropriation to the school has resulted in longer school terms and better salaries and that the free text book law has been a great benefit. He will recommend the observance of such holidays as Thanksgiving Day and Christmas by the closing of the schools. There will be a tabulating the estimated value of school property.
