One good result of the stringent times is shown in the demand in many quarters for small farms. Many people, mostly those who were formerly farmers and moved to cities to better their condition, are going into the country again, where they can at least count on a living. This movement to the country is widespread. In localities where the land is fair, around such cities as Arkon, O., for example, there has been an influx into the country which has caused every farm to be taken.—Franklin News.

WHEN John R. Reed was installed as Collector of the Port of Philadelphia, Wednesday, no one was more cordial in his expression of good wishes than the retiring Collector. It is no small satisfaction for Mr. Cooper to be able to declare that during his incumbency of the position \$70,000,000 had been collected for the Government, without the loss of a cent; and the honorable pride with which he referred to this fact was simply a reflex of the rigid sense of duty which marked the administration during the whole of his term of office.—Blizzard.

THE Presbyterians can stand up under a good deal, but when it comes to saddling such a peculiar Christian as William Campbell Preston Breckinridge upon the church they are privileged to kick. The story is current that this Breckinridge is a prominent Presbyterian, and that his eloquence in behalf of orthodoxy turned the scale against Dr. Briggs in the General Assembly last May. Instead of being a highly honored official of the Presbyterian church, Col. W. C. P. is not even a member of it. He is a son of Rev. Dr. Robert J. Breckinridge, who was a great man in that church, and it was the Congressman's cousin, Judge S. M. Breckinridge, of

St. Louis, who spoke against Dr. Briggs when the Assembly met at Detroit, and who died on the platform just after the close of the speech.—Franklin News.
