125,000 miners; members of the United Mine Worker's, went out on a strike Monday morning, by preconcerted action. 50,000 of the men are in Pennsylvania; the balance being distributed through Alabama, Ohio, Tennessee, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Indian Territory, Missouri and Michigan.

JUDGE Noyes and Associates, held license court in Warren, Monday to consider the applications that were held over from the regular term, the week previous. All of the applications for retail license in Warren were granted, but the applications for wholesale licenses were held over, as were also all the Tidoute applications. The hotels at Irvinston were granted license.

REPRESENTATIVE HINES of Pennsylvania has hit upon a plan that he thinks will quickly scatter Coxe's army upon their arrival in Washington. He proposes to introduce a bill in the House asking for an appropriation of \$10,000 to expend in improving the public country roads in the District of Columbia, and predicts that less than \$500.00 will be expended and that the army will get out of town as soon as possible.

Two prominent city officials of Jamestown, N. Y., have denounced the Democratic party, with which they have heretofore been identified, and profess allegiance to the Republican party. One is Conrad A. Hult, Alderman of the Fourth Ward and leader in the Council. The other is James G. Baker, the City Clerk. Both are men of wide influence, as is shown by their election to office in that strong Republican city, and will carry many Democratic votes with them into the Republican camp.

The question as to whether citizens have a right to remain in a room where the vote is being counted after the poles close has been decided by a Pittsburg judge. On the evening of the last election a number of citizens appeared at the polling place at McKeesport and demanded admittance into the room while the count was being made. This was refused, whereupon the citizens broke open the door and entered. When the case came up in the court, the judge instructed the grand jury to ignore the bill, holding that the men were acting within their rights as citizens, in accordance with the law, to be present, outside the guard rail and in sight and hearing of the election officers while the ballot was being counted.

ACCORDING to the Oil City Biscard: Republican harmony is so thick in Venango county that it couldn't be cut with a knife and if it were not for the prospect of making the fur fly when it comes to selecting Jury Commissioners, life wouldn't be worth living there at present. Hon. C. W. Stone for Congress has no opposition in county or district; for Representative, Hon. Henry F. James and Hon. J. L. Mattox have no opposition; for State Senate, H. J. Hopkins is Venango's choice; for District Attorney, Coroner and Delegates to the State Convention there is no opposition, but for Jury Commissioner there are four candidates, viz: William Griffin, of Franklin, W. C. Davidson, of Franklin, Joseph H. Bell, of Franklin, and James McCracken, not of Franklin. The Biscard expresses the hope that in their anxiety to secure the coveted prize, these gentlemen will do nothing to disturb the placidity of the Republican Pond.
