REPUBLICANS SWEEP EVE-RYTHING BEFORE THEM AGAIN.

They Have Held their own States and Carried Some of the Democratic Gibraltars.

Pennsylvania Leads Them all, With More Than 150,000 to Spare.

New York, Ohio, Maryland, Massachusetts, and Probably New Jersey and Kentucky in Line.

FOREST COUNTY'S CLEAN SWEEP.

At this writing returns are yet mesgre from the county, but enough are in to indicate that the Republicans have elected all their county ticket. The strong fight was made on the Associate Judgeship, but there is no doubt but that the Republicans have landed their candidate, Mr. McCray in the chair by a very nice majority, and likewise Mr. Fones as county treasurer. Judge Noyes ran considerably ahead of his ticket in the county for Superior Court Judge.

Latest returns indicate that Mr. McCray's majority will be 250 to 300. Mr. Fones' will be in the neighborhood of 400.

Official figures next week. PENNSYLVANIA.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 5. - Returns received up to midnight indicate that Benjamin J. Haywood, Republican, has been elected State Treasurer by about 150,000 plurality, a Republi can gain over 1893, which was also an off year, of about 15,000. This State also elects seven judges of the new superior court. Of these the six Republicans nominated are elected as follows; James A. Beaver, Edward N. Willard, John J. Wickham, Charles K. Rice, Howard J. Reeder, Geo. B. Orlady. The seventh man on the ticket is in

doubt. The Democrats have six men on the ticket and returns indicate that each of these has ron ahead of the ticket in his own section. The choice apparently lies between Magee, of Allegheny county; Smith, Lackawanna, and Yerkes, Bucks, with the chances favoring the former.

Careful estimates of the vote in the 67 counties of Pennsylvania show a plurality for Benjamin J. Haywood, Republican for State Treasurer, over Benjamin K. Meyers, Democrat, of 157,919, a gain, as compared with the vote of 1893, for the same office, of 22,273. It will probably require the official count to determine who is the Democratic member of the superperior court.
