

ELECTION AFTERMATH.

As the smoke of last week's battle of ballots clears away the splendid results of Republican victory become more apparent, and that victory is found to be more pronounced than was at first supposed.

As a result of the election the Republicans gain five United States Senators—two from Utah and one each from Kentucky, Ohio and Maryland, and the Democrats lose three Senators—one each from Maryland, Kentucky and Ohio.

Pennsylvania—The old Keystone still holds her place as the banner Republican State of the Union, electing Haywood State Treasurer by the enormous majority of 174,442 in an off year.

Ohio—The majority for Bushnell, Republican for Governor, is close to the 100,000 mark, the latest figures putting it about 95,000.

Maryland—For the first time Maryland has been captured by the Republicans, they have carried nearly every county in the State.

Kentucky—For the first time in its history Kentucky has elected a Republican governor, Col. Bradley having defeated Gen. Harding by about 10,000 plurality.

New York—The plurality of Palmer, Republican candidate for Secretary of State, is about 90,000, or three times as great as his plurality in 1893.

In New York City the Tammany plurality is about 17,000, while Brooklyn elected Wurster, Republican candidate for mayor, over Groat Democrat, by between 2,000 and 3,000 plurality.

New Jersey—The majority for Griggs, Republican candidate for governor, is 26,467. The Senate will stand 18 Republicans and 3 Democrats; the House 43 Republicans, 16 Democrats and 1 Independent.

Utah—The Republicans elected their State ticket by pluralities ranging from 1,000 to 1,800. The legislature will be Republican by a majority of 29 on joint ballot, which means a gain of two Republican U.S. Senators.

Iowa—The Republican State ticket it elected by about 90,000 plurality, and the legislature is overwhelmingly Republican.

Kansas—The Republicans re-elected David Martin chief justice by about 40,000 plurality.

Massachusetts—The vote for governor was: Greenhalge, Republican, 185,900; Williams, Democrat, 121,401; Kendall, Prohibitionist, 8,766; Republican plurality, 64,499.

Nebraska—The latest returns indicate the election of the Republican ticket by about 10,000 plurality.

Mississippi—The Democrats carried the State by about 50,000 plurality.

CHAIRMAN CARTER has called a meeting of the Republican National Committee, to be held at the Arlington Hotel, Washington, December 10, for the purpose of designating the time and place for holding the National Convention in 1896.

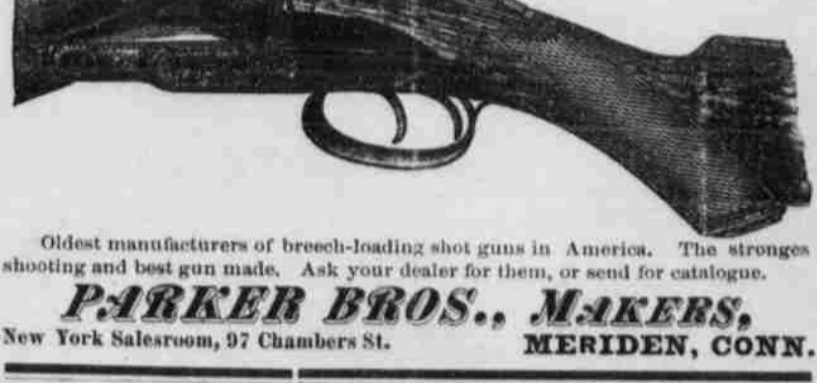
