THE WAR NEWS.

The first capture of the war with Spain was made by the U. S. gunboat Nashville, which overhauled the Beuna Ventura, a merchant ship carrying the Spanish fing, and a shot war that is now on.

The Havana harbor has been completely blockaded by the U. S. fleet under Rear Admiral Sampson. Saturday night the first shot from Spain disdaining Spain's wretched gonnery, maintained a dignified silence.

MORE PRIZES.

Yesterday the Navy Department, through news channels not available to newspapers, is said to have received information that several vessels of Sampson's fleet cited a large steamer, supposed to be the Monserrat, fifteen miles east of Matanzas. They signalled to pursue her and immediately put off after the prize. They have not been heard from since. The Monserrat carries a thousand soldiers and a half million in silver.

Another special from Key West says the United States gunboat Newport has brought in two prizes, a sloop and a schooner.

Yesterday's events developed nothing of a startling nature in war circles, and all seems quiet this morning.


