OLEO TRUST BEATEN.

Republicans After a Hard Fight Fulfill Their Pledge to the Farmers.

LABOR ALSO WELL CARED FOR with the employment of these who pur-

regislation in Favor of the Miners and Against Company Stores--The "Bal lot Reform Liars" Busy.

(Special Correspondence.) Harrisburg, May 28.—The Republi can leaders have done great work in evercoming opposition to their plans to have this legislature make an unusually good record in the recognition of the claims of the farming and the laboring elements of the state.

Despite the miserable attempts of the enemies of the stalwart Republican or ganization to misrepresent the attitude of Governor Stone, the officers of the department of agriculture under his administration, and the influential leaders of the Republican party of Pennsylvania, the action of the stalwart Republicans in this legislature give a most emphatic answer to their insurgent and Democratic critics.

For the last two years efforts have made to create the impression that some mysterious influences were being exerted in antagonism to the farmers and in the interests of the manufacturers and dealers in oloomorgarine.

Columns after columns of newspape stories have been printed to make the people believe that the farmers' in terests were being neglected and that they could never hope to get any consideration from the present leadership of the Republican party.

Notwithstanding the existence of # very powerful oleo lobby here the stalwart Republican leaders, with Senntors Quay and Penrose, and Governor Stone and his associates in his administration actively working to the same end, the Republican members of the senate and the house have passed the Harris-Snyder anti-oleomorganine bill and one of the most desperately fought contests at this session of the legislature is at an end.

BUTTER MAKERS HAPPY.

This bill, the fight for which was led by Representative Harris, of Clear field, in the house, and Senator Spyder of Chester county, in the senate, is exactly what the farmers and the representatives of the pure butter organiza tion desired.

Of the several clauses in this bill which so deeply affects the interests of farmers of the state, the first is the color clause, which forbids oleo from being colored in imitation of yellow butter and fixing fines and penalties for violation thereof. The second-feature of the bill prevents dealers from selling oleo for butter until their cases have been decided by the courts. This feature of the bill is very similar to the New York law, which has been ac effectual is suppressing the sale of

islature are those affecting the laboring interests. One of these is known as the company store order bill. This measure is designed to so tax the or ders for wages given on stores operated by employers of labor so as to encourage competition from private firms and corporations having no connection

After a hearing, in which representatives of miners from different parts of the state were present, a bill has finally been agreed upon which it is believed will go a great distance toward the abolition of the company store evil in Pennsylvania.

Another bill that has passed is that which requires owners of coal mines to keep medicine chests and surgical appliances in the mines for the cure of infured miners.

Another bill increases the number of mine inspectors, who will be required

to make frequent inspections of the mines to insure the safety of those employed in them. "BALLOT REFORM LIARS."

Timely and fitting comment is made by Editor W. H. Bandborn, of the North East (Pa.) Breeze, upon the insincerity and hypocrisy of what he is leased to style the "Ballot Reform Liars," who have been seeking to misend the people on the subject.

"The fact of the matter," says Editor Sandborn, "Is Just this:

"The present ballot is satisfactory to the people, but the insurgents and smocrate wanted an insue to go before the people with, and "ballot reform," like "free silver," was a catching and foud sounding name, and might, therefore, have weight with that class of voters who are "agin the poverament" at all times, providing the issue smells of "something for nothing," or a chance to ride into ofice upon a wave of false pretenses.




