For the tranquility and plenty with which we have been blessed I hereby call upon the people of the Commonwealth to cease their ordinary avocations and to assemble in their respective places of worship on the day named, to render devout thanks to Almighty God for His unspeakable goodness and to supplicate a continuance of His favor.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State, in the city of Harrisburg, this seventh day of November, in the year of our Lord 1901 and of the Commonwealth the one hundred and twenty-sixth.
