### PROVISIONAL RESOLUTIONS.

An Appeal Will Be Made to National Civic Federation.

Shamokin, Pa., March 25.—The resolution presented at Sunday's session of the convention of the United Mine Workers of America by the special committee appointed on Saturday contained a provisional strike declaration and was unanimously adopted.

After its adoption President Mitchell made a statement explanatory of the resolution. It recites the grievances adopted by the convention, the main features of which are: a shorter work day and uniform increase in wages, under the present low wages and indefinite conditions of employment, and provides for a general suspension of work to take effect upon a date to be designated by the executive boards of districts 1, 7 and 8.

It provides, however, that before resorting to a strike an appeal be made to the executive committee of the industrial department of the National Civic Federation. Should this action fail prior to April 1 and after that date negotiations are still pending, all anthracite mine workers, except those necessary to keep the mines in repair, are to remain away from the mines, on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays of each week.

Commenting on the action of the convention President Mitchell said: "I am free to confess a strike is imminent."

Unless the efforts of the Civic Federation are effective with the coal operators it is more than likely that a repetition of the struggle of 1909 will occur in the anthracite region. In that year 140,000 employees of the anthracite mines were on strike for six weeks. Before the completion of the draft of the resolution, President Mitchell telegraphed the presidents of the coal carrying roads making a last appeal for a conference. He received several replies all of which refused to meet the representatives of the union. The other presidents made no response. The purpose of the suspending of work at the mines three days in each week after April 1, if negotiations are then pending, is to prevent storage of coal by the companies by producing an amount sufficient only to supply the existing needs of the market.

**Mexican Tortillas.**
