



John W. Mackay, president of the Commercial Cable company, died at his residence in London.

By a collision of Lehigh passenger trains at Rochester one man was killed and 25 persons injured.

Four persons lost their lives by a cloudburst and flood near Coventry, Broome county, N. Y.






