Republican County Committee Meeting. A meeting of the Republican County Committee of Forest County will be held at the Court House, Tionesta, Monday evening, Feb. 23, 1903, at 7:30 o'clock.

HAYS WINS IN PITTSBURG. The election in Pittsburgh yesterday, the hottest in years, resulted in the election of Wm. B. Hays, the fusion Citizens-Democrat candidate for Recorder, by from 5,000 to 7,000 majority.

CONGRESS has demonstrated its faith in President Roosevelt's leadership. A PEACEFUL and satisfactory outcome of the Venezuelan situation is now secured.

A SMOKELESS locomotive is the latest triumph of an American inventor. THE Ship Subsidy bill will not be passed at this session.

OVER 27,000,000 tons of ore were brought out of the Lake Superior region by lake transportation last year.

PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT says he is much pleased with the anti-trust legislation accomplished at this session of Congress.

CANADA is reported to be arranging a plan of border defense. It needs a high order of military genius to enable 5,000,000 people to close all the doors against 70,000,000.

THE United States produces nine-tenths of the world's cotton, one-half its coal and copper and one-fourth its iron. These industries have been developed by the protective policy.

RICHARD OLNEY, Democratic candidate for the presidency, a corporation lawyer to lead to victory the great anti-trust legislation. Shades of Thomas Jefferson, (and Mr. Bryan.)

THE passage of effective anti-trust legislation has caused havoc in the prediction departments of many Democratic newspapers. The Republican party seldom fails to do havoc there.

OCCASIONALLY it has been said that the United States spends too much money on naval construction. The remark was not indulged in at the beginning of the war with Spain nor is it heard now.

THE perfection of the Republican organization in the Senate was never better demonstrated than by the accomplishment of three excellent anti-trust bills in the face of the Statehood blockade.

BRITISH pottery works employ 25,000 women and children. American pottery works pay living wages to the fathers and the women are free to raise their families and the children to attend school.

THE Monroe doctrine means, among other things, that Europe can save itself humiliation and vast numbers of millions by relinquishing forever the idea of seizing a single inch of American territory.

A good deal of American money will go into the isthmian canal, but much of it will be spent for American material and expert labor. The digging of the canal will decidedly assist to maintain prosperity.

CARROLL D. WRIGHT, commissioner of labor, is quoted as saying that the wages now paid in the United States are higher than ever before in the history of the country. The highest level, up to the present time, he says, was made in 1892.

WHEN asked if he is a candidate for a third term, Mr. Cleveland replies: "I can not possibly bring my mind to the belief that a condition or sentiment exists that makes any expression from me on the subject of the least importance."

THE surcharge of the late Commissioner of Clearfield county in the sum of \$75 looks very small when compared to the surcharge of \$15,435 against the commissioners of York county, who were overtaken in crooked work. The ex-county treasurer of that county is also \$15,353 in arrears, and the tax payers are hunting after the money.—Clarion Democrat.

You must remember that York is a strongly Democratic county and the discrepancy would naturally be much larger on that account.

THE policy of protection is the foundation of our whole industrial system. Nine-tenths of our industrial capital is invested, nine-tenths of our industrial wage scales and other arrangements are made, upon the supposition that this nation will continue by law to reserve the home market for home producers. To begin to repeal the tariff would be to disturb all these arrangements. It would unsettle business. It would destroy commercial confidence in the future. It would bring on hard times. That is what tariff tinkering by the Democratic party has always done in the past. That is what it certainly will do again.

TO SETTLE THE TROUBLE.

Matter of Street Car Feed Wire Through Monongahela. Monongahela, Feb. 16.—At a special meeting of the Monongahela city council steps were taken which will probably result in the settlement of the deadlock which has existed for some time between Monongahela and the Pittsburgh and Charleroi Street Car company.

About the middle of January the street car company undertook to stretch a feed wire through this place and ignored the notice from the city council to discontinue its construction. Mayor Bentley and a number of citizens, by the order of City Solicitor Charles G. McVaine, tore down the wire. The Washington county courts were appealed to by the street car company and the case decided against the city.

At the meeting a communication from the street car company was presented, asking that a commission be appointed to meet with it and adjust the matter.

OLD MINT'S CORNER STONE. Secretary Shaw Has Asked Mr. Shipley to Give It Up. Philadelphia, Feb. 16.—When the old mint in this city was sold, Samuel R. Shipley, president of the Provident Life and Trust company of this city, a member of an old Quaker family, bought the corner stone. Now Washington has awakened to the relic's historical value and has practically demanded it through Secretary Shaw for the Smithsonian Institution.

Mr. Shipley said: "I have acquired the title to it. I bought it and paid for it. I was interested in the purchase of the mint and after we bought it all others interested agreed that I should have the corner stone. I shall not resist the government."

The corner stone, by the way, has not been found although the mint has been levelled to the ground. Where it has gone is a mystery.

Change River's Course. New Castle, Pa., Feb. 16.—The Pennsylvania Railroad company has begun the gigantic undertaking of changing the course of the Mahoning river near Carbon, six miles west of this city, in order to eliminate a long curve. Near Carbon the cut will be nearly half a mile in length, and the public road on the other side of the Mahoning will also have to be changed. Other cuts will also be made between here and Youngstown in the line with the general improvement of transportation facilities. When the curves are eliminated the running time and drawing power of locomotives will be far superior to those at present.

Stock is Active. Oil City, Feb. 16.—The continued strength in the stock of the Manufacturers Light and Heat company, culminating in the sensational advance on the Pittsburgh Stock Exchange, evoked considerable interest in this city and quotations from Pittsburgh were eagerly watched. These close to the directors predict the stock will sell above 100.

They say the purchase of the Wheeling Gas company, in the affairs of which the late Wesley Chambers of this city was a prominent factor, and the completion of the proposed \$3,000,000 pipe line to West Virginia make the Manufacturers position impregnable.
