The Woman's Relief Corps.

The Woman's Relief Auxiliary to the Grand Army of the Republic, is the largest benevolent patriotic organization of women in the world, numbering now almost 150,000 members.

To maintain true allegiance to the United States of America; to inculcate lessons of patriotism and love of country among our children and in the communities in which we live;

This institution was the first to introduce the salute to the flag in the public schools and to make the observance of Flag Day general.

There are two salutes to the flag taught in the public schools, the one for the older scholars being: "I pledge allegiance to my flag and to the Republic for which it stands."

The other is taught to the younger pupils, and is: "Give my head and heart to God and my country; one country, one language, one flag."

The Woman's Relief Corps is a national incorporation and owns and operates the National Relief Corps Home, Madison, Ohio. It is in possession of the Andersonville prison grounds, which it has converted into a National park.

For the year ending June 30, 1903, the national treasurer has expended: For W. R. C. Home, \$2,722.17; for decoration of soldiers' graves in the South, \$1,197.96; for the Kansas flood sufferers, \$800; for the McKinley memorial, \$1,000; for relief, \$156,709.19.

The number of persons assisted has been 40,433.

In the organization there are 2,906 Corps. The total expenditure of last year in the order amounted to \$30,573.35 and there are no liabilities.

Since the organization of the W. R. C. there has been expended \$2,504,365.23.

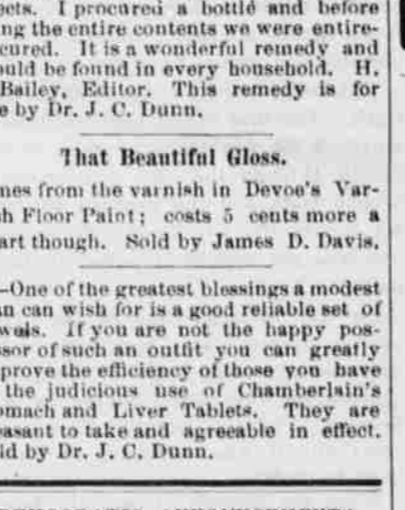
