

Sportsmen will do well to clip the following and paste it in their hunting caps: The open season for game under the new law is as follows:

Woodcock, October 1-December 1. Ruffed grouse, October 15-December 1. Quail, November 1-December 1. Deer, November 15-December 1. Suirrel, October I-December 1. Rabbit, November 1-December 1, Bear, October 1-March 1, Plover, July 14 .- December 1. Rail birds, September 1-January 1. Wild fowl, September 1-January 1. Wild turkey, October 15-December 1. The amount of game that it is lawful to kill under the new act is as follows:

GEMS IN KENTUCKY.

Expert Says Kimberlite Indica's Diamonds May Be Found There.

New York, Oct. 3 .- Kentucky blds fair to produce a diamond mine sufree training in nursing. It is planned to perior to the great properties in South Africa. David Draper, geologist and curator of the South African Museum of Mines and Minerals, Johannesburg, South Africa, said so.

Mr. Draper said: "Having examined the Kentucky kimberlite found near Ison's creek and Creeches creek, I have come to the conclusion that during my experience in diamond mining in South Africa, extending over a period of 36 years, from the earliest discov-State to the present, I have not come across a more favorable locality for cheap working, nor one in which such an immense quantity of decomposed kimberlite can be mined under better

"I would recommend most strongly that large quantities of the decor posed mineral be mined and treated in order to test its value as a diamond
