



The truth of the matter is that Mr. Allen's announcement came before Mr. Camings', and Mr. Allen doesn't appear to have consulted any considerable number of the people of Forest county as to whether they would have a home candidate, but placed his announcement very early in the game, long before any date even had been fixed for holding the primary election.

Mr. Allen would have the voters believe that he had no notice of Mr. Wheeler's intention to be a candidate, when the fac's are that he was as fully and promptly informed as was Mr. Cumings, and after consultation with his advisers, positively refused to withdraw from Forest county. What "party managers" advised this course on his part? And who are the "party managers" that advised Mr. Allen that Forest county would have no home candidate?

Mr. Allen's assumption that Forest county has no right to have a home candidate is very ungrateful to say the least, and is not shared by any considerable number of its people. He is the only man of all the other four counties comprising the district to contest Forest county's right to present a home candidate. Has Forest county any rights at all in this district? We think she has,




