Has Forest County Any Rights?

Within the past week Forest county has been flooded with circular letters from Mr. O. C. Allen, of Warren county, bearing on his Congressional candidacy in this county, and which cast some uncalled-for reflections upon the home candidate, Hon. N. P. Wheeler.

A LARGE portion on San Francisco is built on made ground, and numerous business blocks stand on land formerly covered by the waters of the bay. Much of the remainder of the city was built upon sand. The work of reconstruction requires a careful study of the foundations of the city.

Mr. Allen further says: "Although not a citizen of your county, I came into it after Mr. Cummings had announced, and as he states in his withdrawal announcement, supposing that no local candidate could be put up in your county for the position of Congress."

The truth of the matter is that Mr. Allen's announcement came before Mr. Cummings, and Mr. Allen doesn't appear to have consulted any considerable number of the people of Forest county as to whether they would have a home candidate, but placed his announcement very early in the game, long before any date even had been fixed for holding the primary election.

Mr. Allen would have the voters believe that he had no notice of Mr. Wheeler's intention to be a candidate, when the fact is that he was as fully and promptly informed as was Mr. Cummings, and after consultation with his advisers, positively refused to withdraw from Forest county.

Mr. Allen's assumption that Forest county has no right to have a home candidate is very ungrateful to say the least, and is not shared by any considerable number of its people. He is the only man of all the other four counties comprising the district to contest Forest county's right to present a home candidate. Has Forest county any rights at all in this district? We think she has.

The response to California's appeal has been prompt, universal and substantial. Relief has been and is still going forward by ship loads, by train loads and by wagon loads.
