**PROCLAMATION OF GENERAL ELECTION.**

Whereas, In and by the act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to amend the tenth section of an act, entitled 'An Act to regulate the nomination and election of public officers, requiring certain expenses incident thereto to be paid by the several counties and publishing certain notices in regard to such elections,' approved the 26th day of June, A. D. 1905, it is made the duty of the Sheriff of every county within this Commonwealth to give public notice of the General Elections, and in such notice to—

- I. Enumerate the officers to be elected and give a list of all the nominations made as provided in this act, and to be voted for in such county, and the full text of all constitutional amendments submitted to a vote of the people, but the proclamations posted in each election district need not contain the names of any candidates but those to be voted for in such district.
- II. Designate the place at which the election is to be held.
- III. He shall give notice that every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment or profit or trust under the government of the United States, or of this State, or of any city, or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent who is or shall be employed under the legislative, executive or judiciary departments of this State, or of the United States, or of any city, or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for, except that of an election officer.
- IV. Alonzo W. Stroup, High Sheriff of the County of Forest, do hereby make known and give this public notice to the electors of the County of Forest that a General Election will be held in said County, on—

**Tuesday, November 6th, 1906.**

between the hours of 7 a. m. and 7 p. m. at the several Election Districts. The following are the officers to be elected, and a list of all the nominations made therefor, and which shall be voted for in the form in which they shall appear upon the ballots:

The Electors of Barnett Township as follows: Those residing in the Cooks-

burg Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the Tylerburg and Clarington road where the said road crosses or intersects with the west line of Barnett Twp., thence in a southeasterly direction by the various courses and distances of said road to a point where the said road crosses the East branch of Coleman Run; thence down the said run by its various courses and meanderings to the Clarion River; thence down the said river by the various courses and distances thereof to the southwest corner of Barnett Twp., thence northerly by the west line of said Township to the place of beginning, shall vote at Cooks-burg Hall.

The Electors of Barnett Township as follows: Those residing in the Redkey Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the said Tylerburg and Clarington road where the same intersects with the northern line of warrant No. 2505; thence by the northern line of said warrant 2505, easterly to the west line of warrant No. 3148; thence by the west line of said warrant 3148 easterly to the northwest corner of said warrant No. 3148, thence easterly by the northern line of said warrant No. 3148 and the north line of warrant No. 3145 to the eastern line of Barnett Twp.; thence northerly by the east line of said Township to the northeast corner of Barnett Twp.; thence westerly by the northern line of said township to the northwest corner of Barnett Twp.; thence by the west line of said Township southerly to the intersection of the northern line of said township with the Tylerburg and Clarington road; thence southeasterly by the various courses and distances of said road to the place of beginning, shall vote at Joseph Hall's Carpenter Shop.

The Electors of Barnett Township as follows: Those residing in the Clarington Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the said Tylerburg and Clarington road where the said road intersects with the northern line of warrant No. 2505; thence southeasterly along said road by the various courses and distances thereof to a point where the said road crosses the eastern branch of Coleman Run; thence down the said run by its various courses and distances thereof to the Clarion River; thence up the said River by its various courses and distances to the southeast corner of Barnett Township; thence by the north line of said warrant No. 3145; thence westerly by the north line of said warrant No. 3145 to the northwest corner of said warrant No. 3148; thence southerly by the west line of said warrant No. 3148 to the northeast corner of said warrant No. 2505; thence by the north line of said warrant No. 2505 westerly to the place of beginning, shall vote in the County and Township House.

The Electors of Howe township residing in the Election District of East Howe, to-wit: Those residing within the territory embraced by the following boundary lines, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the Warren and Forest county line where the same is intersected by the east line of warrant 2736; thence south along the eastern boundary lines of warrants 2736, 2501, the Fox Estate, and warrant 2505 to the northwest corner of subdivision No. 61 in warrant 2736; thence east along the northern boundary lines of warrants 2736, 2508 and 2464, to the Elk and Forest county line; thence north along the Elk and Forest county line to the northeast corner of the place of beginning, shall vote at Brookston in Brookston Library Hall.

The Electors of Howe township residing in the Election District of East Howe, to-wit: Those residing within the territory embraced by the following boundary lines, to-wit: Beginning at the northeast corner of warrant 2464, and in the line dividing Elk and Forest counties; thence south along said dividing line to the line between Howe and Jenks township; thence west along said last mentioned line to the southwest corner of K. Blood's subdivision; thence north along the west line of the K. L. Blood subdivision and warrants 396, 454, 2678, 2380 to the northwest corner of warrant No. 69 in warrant 2505; thence east along the north line of subdivisions 69, 68, 65, 64 and 61 of warrant 2505 and subdivisions 51, 52, 53, 54 and 55 of warrant 2736, and subdivisions 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25 of warrant 2508 and the north line of warrant 2464 to the Elk county line, the place of beginning, shall vote at Noblet's Hall, Frost's Station.

The Electors of Howe township residing in the Election District of West Howe, to-wit: Those residing west of the above described Middle Howe Election District, shall vote at the Porkey School House, at Porkey.

The Electors of Howe township residing in the Clough's Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the territory recently cut off from the Baltown Election District, viz: Beginning at a point on the east line of the Baltown Election District where the north line of warrant 2199 intersects the same; thence west along the north line of warrants 2189, 2188 and 430 to the northeast line of warrant 430; thence along the southeast line

of lines of warrant 430 to warrant 5101; thence along the northeast line of warrant 5101 to warrant 5265; thence along the northwest line of warrants 5101 and 5104 to the Kingsley township line, shall vote at P. M. Rest Building, Clough's Mills.

The electors of Jenks township residing in the Election District of Byrom, shall vote in Berg's Hall, at Duhring in said township.

The electors of Jenks township residing in the Lamona Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Commencing at the northwest corner of warrant 354, thence south by west line of warrant 354 to the south line of warrant 4126, thence east by the County line to the southeast corner of warrant 4126, thence north by north line of warrant 4130, thence by north line of warrant 4130 to the southeast corner of warrant 350, thence north by line of warrant 350 and 350 to the northeast corner of warrant 350, thence west by south line of warrant 350 to the southwest corner of same, thence north to the northeast corner of warrant 354, thence west to the place of beginning at the north line of warrant 354, thence north by the eastern part of warrant 4126, warrants 4126, 353 and 353, as shown on the official map of Forest county, to the place of the Old Lamona Store building, at Lamona.

The electors of Jenks township residing in the Martintown Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the territory outside the above mentioned election districts of Byrom and Lamona, shall vote at the Election and Township House in Martintown.

The Electors of Kingsley township residing in the Election District of Kellettsville, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at the common corner of warrants 5217, 5218, 5223 and 5224, said corner being on the line dividing Hickory and Kingsley townships, thence southeasterly along the line of warrants 5217 and 5224, 5215 and 5215, 5215 and 5236, 5236 and 5236, to the line dividing Kingsley and Howe townships; thence south along said township line to a post where the same intersects or crosses the southeast line of warrant 5180; thence southwestwardly along the line dividing warrants 5180 and 5119, 5119 and 5119, 5128 and 5128, to the southwest corner of warrant 5128; thence along the southwest line of warrant 5128 to the northwest corner thereof, thence northeasterly along the northwest line of warrant 5128 to a point where the Petree & Co. land entered the line between warrants 5128 and 5189; thence along said Petree & Co. southwest line to the line dividing warrants 5269 and 5189; thence from said line to a point in the public road known as the Tionesta creek and Hickory road, where the same intersects what is known as the Balltown road; thence along the said Tionesta creek and Hickory road northwardly to a point where the same crosses the Hickory and Kingsley township line; thence along said Hickory and Kingsley township line northwesterly to the place of beginning, shall vote in Andrews Hall, at Kellettsville.

The Electors of Kingsley Township residing in the Mayburg Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the territory lying to the northeast of the above described Election District of Kellettsville, shall vote at the County House in said district.

The Electors of Kingsley Township residing in the Newtown Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the territory lying to the southwest of the above described Election District of Kellettsville, shall vote at the Township House, near the northwest end of Newtown bridge.

The electors of Tionesta township at the Township House, near the southeast end of the Tionesta creek bridge, at the mouth of said creek.

The electors of Tionesta borough at the Court House in said borough.

I also make known the following provisions of the new Constitution of Pennsylvania.

**ARTICLE VIII.**  
**SUFFRAGE AND ELECTION.**

Sec. 1. Every male citizen twenty-one years of age, possessing the following qualifications, shall be entitled to vote at all elections:

First—He shall have been a citizen of the United States at least one month before the day of the election.

Second—He shall have resided in the State one year, (or, if having previously been a qualified elector or native born citizen of the State he shall have resided thereon and returned, then six months,) immediately preceding the election.

Third—He shall have resided in the election district where he offers to vote at least two months immediately preceding the election.

Fourth—If twenty-two years of age or upwards he shall have offered to vote in a State or county tax which shall have been assessed at least two months and paid at least one month before election.

Sec. 2. The general election shall be held annually on the Tuesday next following the first Monday of November, but the General Assembly may, from time to time, by law, provide for a different day, two-thirds of all the members of each house consenting thereto.

Notice is hereby given, that any person accepting Justices of the Peace who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the United States, or this State, or any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent who is or shall be employed under the legislative, executive or judiciary department of this State, or in any other office of any incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, or of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the time, the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election in this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of such election shall be eligible to be then voted for.

The Justices of the aforesaid districts shall representatively take charge of the certificates of return of the election of their respective districts, and produce them to the Prothonotary office in the Borough of Tionesta, as follows: "All judges living within twelve miles of the Prothonotary's office, or within twenty-four miles if of any city, county or commission of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the time, the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election in this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of such election shall be eligible to be then voted for."
