Three Lake Liners Driven Aground. A terrific gale which biew 90 miles an hour at times swept Buffalo for 18

hours Sunday and has done \$1,500,000 damage to shipping. Five large lake liners wintered just inside the breakwall were torn loose from their moorings and driven aground. They are believed to be resting on soft bottom and unless the gale

becomes worse will probably not suffer more damage. For hours the gale swept the waterfront with unabated fury, tearing

everything that stood in its path. Docks and wharves were wrecked and morrow. carried away. Craft broken from their moorings smashed against bridges do-
