Soldier Killed by Falling Limb. Watertown, N. Y., Jan. 22.—Private Kenneth Ramsey, aged 25, of the 23rd infantry, stationed at Madison Harbor, was killed in Sackets Harbor Sunday by being struck on the back by a limb blown from a tree during the violent wind storm.

Twenty-Two Dead in Big Four Wreck.

Twenty-two charred and mutilated bodies have been taken from the smoldering ruins of the accommodation passenger train on the Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago and St. Louis (Big Four) railroad following its destruction Saturday night by the explosion of a carload of powder as it passed a freight train at Sandford, Ind., five miles west of Terre Haute.
