The country once regarded as uninhabitable is covered with railways, telegraph systems and it is supporting a large population.

A BILL has been introduced in the House at Harrisburg to amend the bill fixing the minimum salary of school teachers at \$35 a month. It provides that teachers in all districts receiving state aid shall receive \$50 a month where the teacher holds a professional, permanent or normal school certificate, has had two years experience and presents a certificate of proficiency from the superintendent in charge. The \$35 salary for all other teachers shall remain. The increase of \$15 for the \$50 class shall be made up by the district paying one-fifth and the state four-fifths. The superiutendent of public instruction must withhold all appropriations to any district refusing to comply with the law.

A BILL amending the new road law under which Road Supervisors were elected for the first time in February last year, provides for the pay for said Supervisors at the rate of \$3 a day, provided make clear complexions, bright eyes and that no supervisor shall receive over \$60 happy thoughts.
