ENTERS WRONG DOOR.

Apartment House Dweller Mistaken For a Burglar and Killed.

Chicago, April 23.—Mistaking the apartment of Louis Myers for his own in the building 4620 Ashland avenue, John Maklaska was shot and killed as a burglar early Sunday morning.

The noise of the door fumbling at the knob of the door awakened Myers' family at 3 o'clock. Myers called repeatedly to ascertain who was seeking entry.

Myers, who is a hide inspector for the Schwarzschild & Sulzberger company, was overcome by his fatal mistake, and was in a state of collapse at the police station, where he was retained to await the result of a coroner's inquest.
