AMONG DEADLY INDUSTRIES.

Making of Safety Matches a Very Unhealthy Occupation.

Neuiste Erfindungen und Erfahrungen sagen dass die production of safety matches still remains a deadly process. The igniting or dipping composition employed contains, as the most essential ingredients, potassium chlorate and potassium chromate, which latter is added to the igniting mass in the proportion of 3 to 4 per cent.

Since the workmen in the match factories come in contact with the chrome salt in grinding the latter. In the preparation of the dripping and igniting composition, in the production of the tips by dipping, as well as in the packing of the finished matches (and several kilos of this poison is daily atomized over the workrooms), the men suffer terribly. Cutaneous disease, headache, debility are frequent. Very often a perforation of the nose results in consequence of ulcerations, the destruction of the same being most acute in users of tobacco.

The destruction of the bridge of the nose can only be attributed to the potassium chromate; hence we are here dealing with a highly serious trade malady.

Beautiful Animal Skins.

Lovers of fine animal skins would have been interested in the collection recently mounted at the workshop of a New York taxidermist. They were all native animals, some half a dozen in number, and represented the fruits of a hunting expedition of President Roosevelt in the Rocky mountains. He had sent them on to be mounted for use in the White House. One of his injunctions to the taxidermist was to mount the heads flat, as he declared that he had too many "stumbling blocks" in the way of mounted heads.

Horseflesh as Meat.

In Belgium the eating of horse flesh dates back to 1870, from which time it has been increasing steadily. In Liege many colts are slaughtered for sale, as well as young horses. The animal undergoes the same rigid inspection given to beef, mutton or pork. The number of horses and colts slaughtered for Liege in 1904 was 1,287, and it is estimated at 2,000 head for 1905. The choice cuts of horse meat sell for about 20 cents a pound, while the beef commands about 35 cents.

Novel Use for Potatoes.

Many persons will be surprised to learn that the potato is used in France in the manufacture of imitation meerschaum pipes and "marble" billiard balls. After the potatoes are peeled they are kept for 36 hours in an 8 percent. solution of sulphuric acid. They are then dried and pressed hard enough for use in making pipes. Under strong pressure they become solid enough to be turned into billiard balls.

Saving Shipwrecked Sailors.

Considerably more shipwrecked sailors are saved by their own boats than by any other means, says London Answers. Thus, of 2,159 persons saved on the coasts of the United Kingdom in 1903-1904, 165 were saved by the rocket apparatus and assistance from the shore, 432 by lifeboats, 143 by coast guard boats and other craft, 641 by passing ships and 735 by their own boats.

Fish Catching by Bees.

The idea of catching fish by means of a beehive with a hole in the top of it is a strange enough one. Yet this, says the Country Gentleman, not inadequately describes the method employed by fishermen in the Philippine Islands, who clap their apparatus down over the sluggish bottom-feeding fish and then, putting their hands through the hole in the top, extract their victims.

Fishing by Bow and Arrow.

In the South seas and in various groups of islands in the Indian ocean the aborigines shoot fish with the bow and arrow. The art is extremely difficult, as in taking aim at an object under water the archer has to allow for refraction. If he were to aim directly at the fish as he sees it, he would, of course, miss. Long practice has, however, made the natives expert in this sport.

Life Convict's Demand.

A life convict in the Andamans had served some long period when an order recently came for his release. All the time he had been in the band, and had evidently so far forgotten that he was a prisoner that on his release he put in a claim for a pension on account of his long and faithful service as a Government servant.

Lax Inspection Laws.

It is said that from eighty to one hundred tons of bone out pork, ready for curing, arrive in Glasgow daily. The pigs are, as a rule, slaughtered on the premises of the small farmers, and at no time before arrival in Glasgow do these carcasses appear to have been examined in order to determine as to their fitness for human food.

Stealing Among Society.

It is calculated that society women at Newport and other fashionable summer resorts in the East were robbed of over \$300,000 worth of jewels in one season. Very few of them were fortunate enough to recover their property.

SLEEP AN INTOXICATION.

Scientist Ascribes Slumber to Carbonic Acid Gas.

Professor Munot of Paris has recently given an interesting answer to this question during the course of a correspondence with a Government scientist at Washington.

According to the Frenchman, sleep may be defined as a kind of intoxication caused by carbonic acid. Experimenting with animals that hibernates in winter, such as the marmot, for instance, Professor Munot has found that during the progress of hibernation there is an accumulation of carbonic acid in the blood of the unconscious animal. Further study has convinced him that the "winter sleep" of hibernating animals does not differ, as far as its causes are concerned, from the ordinary sleep which, for shorter periods, lulls the senses and restores the strength of all animals, including man.

London's Water Supply.

London's original water supply was the River Thames and every apprentice was supplied with a water tankard for transporting the liquid to the house. As early as 1479 there were "water thieves," for in his year a wex chandler in Fleet street had his craft pierced pipe of the conduit within the ground, and so conveyed the water into his cellar; wherefor he was judged to ride through the citee with a conduit upon his hedde." The first official water supply for London was made in Germany. In 1582 Peter Maurice, a German, made an engine at London bridge by which water was conveyed in lead pipes to the citizens' houses, and he and his descendants became rich on the proceeds.

China's Yellow River.

Thousands of men work all their lives at securing the banks of the great Yellow river in China. Yet every now and then the tide sweeps away all opposition and the loss in human life is greater than any war ever caused. Nineteen years ago the river burst its bonds. Day after day the torrent flowed, twenty miles to the hour, thirty miles wide and ten feet deep. The flood has been described as that of five Danubies pouring from a height for two months on end. For 2,000 years the Chinese have been embanking this river.

Rubber from Wheat.

In an article entitled "Rubber Made From Wheat" William T. Walsh writing in reference to this matter says: "The importance of the discovery can scarcely be overestimated, coming as it does at a time when the world is anxiously asking whence its future supplies of rubber are to come. In half a decade, it is said, the annual consumption of the elastic material will be at least 80,000 tons. Even 100,000 tons is regarded by many as a conservative estimate."

Offered Their Services.

Several companies of Siberian militia had volunteered for service at the front. Their offer to Emperor Nicholas read: "We humbly lay at Your Majesty's feet our desire to be permitted to fight and die for the fatherland." The Emperor, in accepting, wrote on the margin of the petition in his own hand. "I thank you sincerely and hope your wishes may be fully realized."

Horse With Wooden Leg.

The veterinary profession is much interested in a surgical operation which has been accomplished by Professor Uriski, one of the staff of the veterinary school at Bucharest. Having amputated a horse's leg at the fetlock joint, after several failures he succeeded in fitting a leather boot or artificial leg that enabled the animal to walk about and take exercise.

Kaiser a Coffee Drinker.

During the days of indignation and anger caused by the Hohenzollern revelations the Kaiser had recourse more than usual to his favorite beverage, Mexican coffee, which, he claims, calms as well as refreshes. He has a supply sent to him periodically from a German colony of planters on the Pacific coast of Mexico.

In the Nation's Capital.

The Nation's capital has the largest collection of anthropological specimens on the face of the globe. Four thousand to five thousand skulls and skeletons of human beings are there preserved. Two hundred brains are arrayed in jars. These are exhibited with those of animals for the purpose of comparison.

The Ancient Greyhound.

The Eastern greyhound has been from time immemorial the hunting dog of the Eastern plains, and making allowances for the artistic attainments of those early periods we find representations of him which are almost identical with the dogs of to-day on the monuments and tombs of ancient Egypt.

Australia's "Bottle Plant."

In the southwestern part of the United States and in Australia there grows in desert places the "bottle plant," which has saved the lives of many men who, smitten by the sun, footsore and well-nigh spent, have almost died for lack of water. The "bottle plant," on being cut, gives out a small flow of the precious nectar. The plant not only holds water, but is shaped like a bottle.

Interesting Grave Excavations.

The excavation of the pre-Christian grave field at Munsingen, near Bern, have, according to the Vossische Zeitung, been discontinued for their year, after no less than 206 graves had been opened and examined. The rich yield is being preserved in the historical museum at Bern, forming one of the most precious collections from the La Tene period (fourth to second pre-Christian centuries). Numerous are in particular the discoveries of arm and foot rings, made of gold, silver, bronze, iron, glass and amber. A gold ring of a girl of 10 years is such an artistic piece of workmanship that even today a lady of rank could wear it. In the same grave was found a necklace of 140 beautiful amber beads. Of weapons there were unearthed, besides lances, etc., sixteen swords, mostly short blades, that evidently were used for cutting. In some graves pots filled with calf and swine bones were found, which recalls the custom of some ancient people of providing their dead with food.

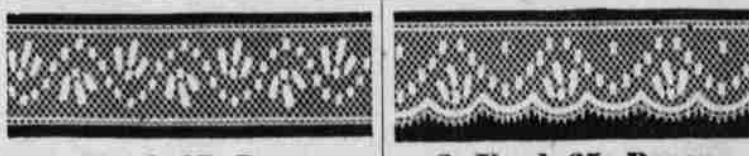
