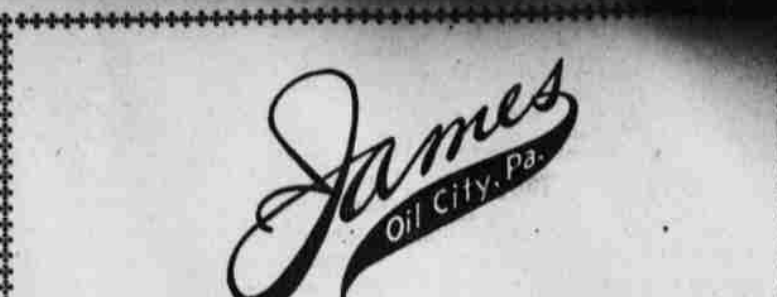

## PENNSYLVANIA RAILROAD

### Bulletin ANNUAL SEASHORE EXCURSION.
