### REPUBLICAN COMMITTEE MEETING

The Forest County Committee Adopts New Rules and Elects a Chairman.

Pursuant to call of the Chairman, Dr. J. C. Dunn, the newly elected Republican County Committee of Forest county met at the Court House in Tionesta, Friday county were represented. The meeting was organized by the election of A. C. Brown, Esq., as president, and Geo. L. King as secretary. A draft of the new rules was submitted by Dr. Dunn, and after a thorough discussion of the same and the adoption of some important additions and amendments the entire set of rules was adopted section by section, the votes in each case being unanimously in the affirmative. Upon the completion of this work the committee proceeded to the election of a chairman for the ensuing year, and the choice fell to County Treasurer Wm. H. Harrison, his being the only name presented.

The new rules adopted seem to cover the ground completely, and it is believed will be entirely satisfactory to the Republicans of the county. Lack of space prevents their publication in this issue of the REPUBLICAN but next week we shall publish them in full.

Upon the completion of the other business the following resolutions were presented and adopted unamimously by the Committee:

Resolved, Ist. That we, the representatives of the Republican party of Forest & Fulton. County, in convention met, hereby reaffirm our adherence to the principles of the Republican party as en various platforms, both State and National.

2. We hereby endorse the wise and progressive administration of President Roosevelt, and highly esteem his successful efforts to control and restrain illegal combinations in restraint of trade, and the abolition of the iniquitous rebate system which our people have suffered and endured so long, and we commend his fearless stand in defense of the people's rights against corporate greed.

3. We heartily commend the wise and consistent administration of Governor Edwin S. Stuart, and point with pride to his fidelity in carring out every pledge made to the voters and citizens of the State during his campaign, and his persistent determination to ferret out and bring to justice any and all that are in any way responsible for, or connected with, the bumilisting capitol scandal.

4.
