Republican Principles Again Prevail Throughout the State and County.

Forest County Did Fine.

The Republicans of Forest county carry their State and county tickets by about the usual 'off-year' majorities. In most of the precincts the vote was light, only about 60 per cent being out, but in some there was close to a full vote out, and the relative Republican majority was fully sustained.

John O. Sheatz, the Republican candidate for state treasurer, carries the county handsomely, and with the meagre figures at hand it is evident his plurality will be considerably over 200.

175,000 FOR SHEATZ.

John O. Sheatz, Republican candidate for treasurer, carries the state by a plurality which is estimated at more than 175,000, the largest in many years in an off-year.

The Republicans of Allegheny county claim to have defeated Brennan, Democratic candidate for Judge, by 12,000 majority, while the Democrats claim Brennan will have 2,000.

Tom Johnson is re-elected mayor of Cleveland by 5,000 majority. In Venango county the Republicans elect their candidate for Sheriff by a large majority.

Crawford county has probably elected Davenport, Republican, President Judge, although the vote was quite close at last reports.

Two Banks Compelled to Close.

Aurora, Ind., Nov. 5.—Owing to the money stringency, the Aurora National bank failed to open yesterday. The bank was organized in 1883 with a capital of \$50,000 and its deposits aggregated \$165,000.

Leontia, O., Nov. 5.—The First National bank here failed to open its doors yesterday. It has a capital of \$100,000. A notice posted on the doors states that the concern will liquidate its liabilities.

Cleveland, Nov. 5.—Richard S. Evans, left halfback of the Wooster, O., university football team, who was injured in a game between Wooster and Western Reserve here on Oct. 5, died yesterday.

Near Columbus, Warren County, 29 cows out of a dairy of 31 were condemned to death on account of being infected with tuberculosis.

Four counties in Western New York will receive \$5,000,000 this fall for their apple crop. They feel mightily comforted with apples as a mortgage lifter.

Right Rev. Monsignor Joseph M. Dunn, pastor of St. Titus, R. C. church at Titusville died Sunday afternoon, after an illness lasting about a year. He was aged 63 years.

The epidemic of diphtheria at Russell, near Warren, is improving, no new cases having developed for several days. Those who are ill are improving rapidly and the critical stage is now considered past.

The prevailing high prices of feed and grain is causing farmers all over the State to sell of their extra cattle and horses at exceedingly low prices.

Angered by boys throwing corn against the window of his home in a Halloween celebration at Oak Ridge, Clarion county, Thursday night, David Bish discharged a shot gun at a crowd.

Two attempts were made last Wednesday night to wreck the Buffalo Express, leaving Pittsburgh at 11 o'clock, near the Dy tower, sixteen miles above Kittanning, at a point where the tracks of the Buffalo & Allegheny Valley division of the Pennsylvania run close to the Allegheny river.

The Oil City Derrick's oil report for October says: 'The Eastern oil fields, which embrace the developments in New York, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Kentucky, completed 1,216 wells in October, inclusive of 278 that were valueless for oil-producing purposes, and the new production was estimated at 12,460 barrels.
