



VISCOUNT AOKI, the Japanese Ambassador to Washington, has been recalled for the purpose of explaining to his sovereign the precise status of the emigration question and the significance of the visit of the Atlantic fleet to Pacific waters. The cordiality of our future relations with Japan will depend largely upon the kind of a report Viscount Aoki makes to the Mikado. It is generally admitted that the recent bankers' panic was entirely unnecessary, and was caused by the baseless fear of depositors withdrawing their money from the banks, thus taking it out of circulation. While there are a great many timid people in this country, with money, who fear to trust the banks, which are however ten times safer than their own custodianship, they would not fear for a moment to trust that money to a bank owned and operated by the Government itself. We should establish Postal Saving banks, into which people could deposit their money and draw a small interest, and thereby keep all of our money in circulation. 
