Injunction Made Permanent.  
Washington, March 24.—The American Federation of Labor and President Gompers and others of that organization were permanently enjoined from "conspiring, agreeing or combining to restrain, obstruct or destroy" the business of the Bucks Stove & Range company, in a decision rendered by Chief Justice C. L. Taft of the supreme court of the District of Columbia, making permanent the temporary injunction of Justice Gould against the Federation in that case. The Federation's counsel immediately noted an appeal to the district court of appeals.  
Two Battleships to Stay in Pacific.  
Washington, March 24.—It is present intention of the navy department to have the battleships Nebraska and Wisconsin accompany the Atlantic fleet on the way around the world. These plans contemplate that two of the battleships of the fleet as it is now constituted will remain on the Pacific coast. Which two will depend upon the recommendations made by Admiral Evans and the condition of the ships. It is not the intention to send any armored cruisers with the fleet on its long voyage.  
To Dismantle Old Mill.  
New Castle, March 24.—Upon orders received from the Carnegie Steel offices at Pittsburg work will begin tomorrow dismantling the old rod mill here. The plant has not been operated for seven years. It is rumored a new steel plant will be built upon the site.
