Governor Signs More Laws.

Governor E. S. Stuart Saturday signed the bill creating a state board of examiners for nurses and prohibiting the use of the title, "registered nurse" by persons not possessing state licenses issued by said board.

The governor also signed the new fish and game bills. The fish bill allows an appeal to court in every case from the decision of a justice of the peace or alderman, and requires the actual catching of fish in an illegal manner to constitute a violation of the act...
