The right of the Legislature to prohibit the wearing of a religious garb by teachers in public schools was upheld by the Superior Court last Thursday.

The interstate commerce commission has rejected the contention that in charging a passenger with no baggage, the same rate of fare is charged another carrying 150 pounds.

The school code bill which was passed by the last legislature and was vetoed by Governor Stuart, contained a provision that any school teacher who contracted to teach for one district and then went to another because an increase of salary was offered, should be barred from teaching anywhere in the State during the remainder of that school year.

The Auditor General has refused to put his official O. K. on any bills of Associate Judges in the Commonwealth, in which mileage charges were made.

The appointment by Governor Stuart of Hon. Jas. N. Moore of Butler, Pa., to be chief of the newly created legislative reference bureau, is one that will reflect credit upon the administration of the Governor.
