PROCLAMATION OF GENERAL ELECTION.

Whereas, in and by the act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to amend the tenth section of an act, entitled 'An Act to regulate the nomination and election of public officers, requiring certain expenses in and thereon to be paid by the several counties and punishing certain offenses in regard to such elections,' approved the 8th day of June, A. D. 1853, it is made the duty of the Sheriff of every county within this Commonwealth to give public notice of the General Elections, and in such to—

I. Enumerate the officers to be elected and give a list of all the nominations made as provided in this act, and to be voted for in such county, and the full text of all constitutional amendments submitted to the vote of the people, but the proclamations posted in each election district need not contain the names of any candidates but those to be voted for in such district.

II. Assigning the place at which the election is to be held.

III. He shall give notice that every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the government of the United States, or of this State, or of any city, or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent who is or shall be employed under the legislative, executive or judiciary departments of this State, or of the United States, or of any city, or incorporated district, and also any member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising under the legislative, executive or judiciary departments of this State, or of any city, or incorporated district, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for, except that an election officer may be elected.

I. S. R. Maxwell, High Sheriff of the County of Venango, do hereby make known and give this public notice to the electors of the County of Forest that a General Election will be held in said County, on

Tuesday, November 2, 1909, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 7 p. m., at the several Election Districts.

The following are the officers to be elected, and a list of all the nominations made therefor, and which shall be voted for in the district in which they shall appear upon the ballots:

Officers to be elected— State Treasurer.

One person for State Treasurer of the State of Pennsylvania.

One person for Auditor General of the State of Pennsylvania.

One person for Judge of the Supreme Court of the State of Pennsylvania.

One person for Associate Judge of the County of Forest.

One person for District Attorney of the County of Forest.

One person for Coroner of the County of Forest.

At the same time the qualified electors will vote on the question of the adoption or rejection of ten proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State of Pennsylvania, and the proposed schedule for the said proposed amendments, in accordance with the manner and form as the same shall appear upon the ballots.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Proposed Amendment No. 1.

Shall Section Eight of Article Four of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

He shall nominate and, by and with the advice and consent of two-thirds of all the members of the Senate, appoint as Secretary of the Commonwealth and an Attorney General during pleasure, a Superintendent of Public Instruction for four years, and such other officers of the Commonwealth as he may see fit or may be authorized by the Legislature, or by law to appoint; he shall have power to fill all vacancies that may happen in offices to which he may appoint, during the recess of the Senate, in the office of Secretary of the Commonwealth, or in the office of Superintendent of Public Instruction, in a judicial office, or in any other elective office which he may be authorized to fill; if the vacancy shall happen during the session of the Senate, the Governor shall nominate to the Senate, before its final adjournment, a proper person to fill said vacancy; but in any such case of vacancy, in an elective office, a person shall be chosen to said office on the next election day appropriate to such office, according to the provisions of this Constitution, unless the vacancy shall happen within two calendar months immediately preceding said election day, in which case the election for said office shall be held on the second succeeding election day appropriate to such office.

In acting on executive nominations the Senate shall sit with open doors, and, in confirming or rejecting the nominations of the Governor, the vote shall be taken by yeas and nays, and shall be entered on the journal.

Proposed Amendment No. 2.

Shall Section Twenty-one of Article Four of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

The terms of the Secretary of Internal Affairs, the Auditor General, and the State Treasurer shall each be four years; and they shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the State at general elections; but a State Treasurer, elected in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, shall serve for three years, and his successors shall be elected at the general election in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in every fourth year thereafter. No person elected to the office of Auditor General or State Treasurer shall be elected in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in every fourth year thereafter.

Proposed Amendment No. 3.

Shall Section Eleven of Article Five of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

Except as otherwise provided in this Constitution, Justices of the peace or aldermen shall be elected in the several wards, districts, boroughs or townships, by the qualified electors thereof, at the municipal election, in such manner as shall be directed by law, and shall be commissioned by the Governor for a term of six years. No township, ward, district or borough shall elect more than two justices of the peace or aldermen without the consent of a majority of the qualified electors within such township, ward or borough; no person shall be elected to such office unless he shall have resided within the township, borough, ward or district for one year next preceding his election. In cities containing over fifty thousand inhabitants, not more than one alderman shall be elected in each ward or district.

Proposed Amendment No. 4.

Shall Section Twelve of Article Five of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

In Philadelphia there shall be established, for each thirty thousand inhabitants, one court of record, of police and civil causes, with jurisdiction not exceeding one hundred dollars; such courts shall be established by the act of the General Assembly, and they shall be elected on general ticket at the municipal election, by the qualified voters at large; and in the election of such courts, the electors shall vote for more than two-thirds of the number of persons to be elected when more than one are to be chosen; they shall be commissioned only by the Governor, and shall exercise such jurisdiction, civil and criminal, except as herein provided, as is now exercised by aldermen, subject to such control as may be exercised by the court of civil jurisdiction or conferring political duties, as may be made by law. In Philadelphia the office of alderman is abolished.

Proposed Amendment No. 5.

Shall Section Two of Article Eight of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

The general election shall be held biennially, on the Tuesday next following the first Monday of November in each even-numbered year, but the General Assembly may by law fix a different day, two-thirds of all the members of each house of the General Assembly concurring. That such election shall always be held in an even-numbered year.

Proposed Amendment No. 6.

Shall Section Three of Article Eight of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

All judges elected by the electors of the State at large may be elected at either a general or municipal election, as circumstances may require. All elections for judges of the courts for the several judicial districts, and for county, city, ward, borough, and township officers for regular terms of service, shall be held on the Tuesday next following the first Monday of November in each odd-numbered year, but the General Assembly may by law fix a different day, two-thirds of all the members of each house of the General Assembly concurring. Provided, That such election shall always be held in an odd-numbered year.

Proposed Amendment No. 7.

Shall Section Fourteen of Article Eight of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

District election boards shall consist of a judge and two inspectors, who shall be chosen biennially, by the citizens at the municipal election, but the General Assembly may require said boards to be appointed in such manner as it may by law provide. Laws regulating the appointment of such boards may be enacted to apply to cities only. Provided, That such laws be uniform for cities of the same class. Each elector shall have the right to vote for the judge and one inspector at each election, and each elector shall be eligible to such office. The first election board for any new district shall be selected, and vacancies in election boards filled, as shall be directed by law. Election officers shall be privileged from arrest upon days of election, and while engaged in making up and transmitting returns, except upon warrant of a court of record, or judge thereof, for an election fraud, for felony, or for wanton breach of the peace. In cities they may claim exemption from jury duty during their terms of service.

Proposed Amendment No. 8.

Shall Section One of Article Twelve of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

All officers, whose selection is not provided for in this Constitution, shall be elected as may be directed by law. Provided, That elections of State officers shall be held on a general election day, and elections of local officers shall be held on a municipal election day, except where in either case the law may be required to fill unexpired terms.

Proposed Amendment No. 9.

Shall Section Two of Article Fourteen of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

County officers shall be elected at the municipal election, and shall hold their offices for the term of four years, beginning on the first Monday of January next after their election, and until their successors shall be duly qualified; all vacancies not otherwise provided for, shall be filled in such manner as may be provided by law.

Proposed Amendment No. 10.

Shall Section Seven of Article Fourteen of the Constitution be amended so as to read as follows?

Three county commissioners and three county auditors shall be elected in each county where such officers are chosen. In the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven and every fourth year thereafter, at the election of said officers, each qualified elector shall vote for no more than two persons, and the three persons having the highest number of votes shall be elected; any casual vacancy in the office of any such officer, or any county auditor shall be filled by the court of common pleas of the county in which such vacancy shall occur, by the appointment of an elector of the proper county by the court of common pleas, or by the elector or auditor whose place is to be filled.

PROPOSED SCHEDULE FOR THE FOREGOING PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Shall the foregoing Proposed Amendments be carried into operation under the following schedule?

That no inconvenience may arise from the changes in the Constitution of the Commonwealth, and in order to carry the same into complete operation, it is hereby declared that—

In the case of officers elected by the people, all terms of office fixed by act of the General Assembly, and in any such case shall be lengthened or shortened by the Legislature may change the length of the term, provided the terms for which such officers are elected shall always be an even number of years.

The above extension of official terms shall not affect officers elected at the general election of one thousand nine hundred and eight; nor any city, ward, borough, or township officers, whose terms of office, under existing law, end in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten.

In the year one thousand nine hundred and ten the municipal election shall be held on the third Tuesday of February, as heretofore; but all officers chosen at that election to an office the regular term of which is two years, and also all election officers and assessors chosen at that election, shall serve until the first Monday of December in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven. All officers chosen at that election to offices the term of which is now four years, or is to be four years by the operation of these amendments to this schedule, shall serve until the first Monday of December in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and all Justices of the peace, magistrates, and aldermen, chosen at that election, shall serve until the first Monday of December in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifteen. After the year nineteen hundred and ten, and until the Legislature shall otherwise provide, all terms of city, ward, borough, and township, and election division officers shall begin on the first Monday of December in an odd-numbered year.

All city, ward, borough, and township officers holding office at the date of the approval of these amendments, whose terms of office may end in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall continue to hold their offices until the first Monday of December of that year.

All judges of the courts for the several judicial districts, and also all county officers, holding office at the date of the approval of these amendments, whose terms of office may end in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall continue to hold their offices until the first Monday of January, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

PLACES OF HOLDING ELECTIONS.

The Electors of Barnett Township as follows: Those residing in the Cooksburg Election District, to-wit: those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the Tylersburg and Clarington road where the said road crosses or intersects with the west line of Barnett Township, thence north by the various courses and

distances of said road to a point where the said road crosses the East branch of the Coleman Run; thence down the said run by its various courses and meanderings to the Clarion River; thence down the said river by the various courses and distances thereof to the southwest corner of Barnett Twp.; thence north by the west line of said Township to the place of beginning, shall vote at Cooksburg Hall.

The Electors of Barnett Township as follows: Those residing in the Reddyffe Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the said Tylersburg and Clarington road where the same intersects with the northern line of warrant No. 330; thence by the northern line of said warrant 330, easterly to the west line of said warrant No. 348; thence by the west line of said warrant northerly to the northwest corner of said warrant No. 348, thence easterly by the northern line of said warrant No. 348 and the eastern line of Barnett Twp., thence northerly by the east line of said Township to the northeast corner of Barnett Township; thence westerly by the northern line of said Township to the northwest corner of Barnett Twp.; thence by the west line of said Township southerly to the intersection of said Township line with the Tylersburg and Clarington road where the same intersects with the various courses and distances of said road to the place of beginning, shall vote at Joseph Hall's Carpenter Shop.

The Electors of Green Township as follows: Those residing in the Clarington Election District, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the said Tylersburg and Clarington road where the said road intersects with the northern line of warrant No. 330; thence southeasterly along said road by the various courses and distances thereof to a point where the said road crosses the East branch of the Coleman Run; thence down the said run by its various courses and distances thereof to the Clarion River; thence up the said River by its various courses and distances to the southeast corner of Barnett Township; thence by the east line of said Township northerly to the northeast corner of warrant No. 345; thence westerly by the north line of warrant No. 345 and the north line of warrant No. 348 to the northwest corner of said warrant No. 348; thence southerly by the west line of said warrant No. 348 to the northeast corner of warrant No. 306; thence by the north line of said warrant No. 306 westerly to the place of beginning, shall vote in the County and Township House at Howes township.

The Electors of Green township as follows: Those residing in the Election District of Gaitonville, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning at a point on the north corner of Warrant No. 513, thence south forty-five degrees west three hundred and twenty rods to the west corner of said tract, thence south forty-five degrees east along the dividing line between tracts Nos. 513 and 565 to the north corner of tract No. 550, thence by the northwest line of tract No. 550 and the southeast line of tracts Nos. 545 and 594, to the south corner of tract No. 594, thence by the north line of the northeast corner of tract No. 530, and southeast corner of tract No. 562 on the Clarion county line, thence by the same east to the west corner of Clarion county, thence north by the Jenks township line to where the said Jenks township line crosses the northeast line of tract No. 550, thence northwesterly by the northeast line of said Jenks township line to the place of beginning, shall vote at the County House at Gaitonville.

The Electors of Green township residing outside of the territory embraced in the above described Election District of Gaitonville, shall vote at the Township House, in Nebraska village.

The Electors of Harmony township as follows: Those residing in the election district of Upper Harmony, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning on the Allegheny River at the place of beginning, shall vote at the County House at Gaitonville.

The Electors of Harmony township residing outside of the territory embraced in the above described Upper Harmony Election District, shall vote at the Township House, in Nebraska village.

The Electors of Kingsley township as follows: Those residing in the election district of Kingsley township, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning on the Allegheny River at the place of beginning, shall vote at the County House at Gaitonville.

The Electors of Kingsley township residing outside of the territory embraced in the above described Kingsley Election District, shall vote at the Township House, in Nebraska village.

The Electors of Kingsley township as follows: Those residing in the election district of Kingsley township, to-wit: Those embraced in the following boundary, viz: Beginning on the Allegheny River at the place of beginning, shall vote at the County House at Gaitonville.

The Electors of Kingsley township residing outside of the territory embraced in the above described Kingsley Election District, shall vote at the Township House, in Nebraska village.
