Announcements.

CONGRESS. ENDRAGON, PA., Nov. 29th, 1909. MY DEAR EDITOR:—You are hereby authorized to announce my name as a candidate for Congress in the Twenty-Eighth Congressional District of Pennsylvania, subject to the rules governing the primary to be held Saturday, June 4th, 1910.

ASSEMBLY. We are authorized to announce A. R. Meehling, of Barnett township, as a candidate for Assembly, subject to the decision of the Republican voters at the primaries, June 4th, 1910.

STATE DELEGATE. We are authorized to announce Asa H. Sigworth, of Jones township, as a candidate for Delegate to the Republican State Convention, subject to the decision of the Republican voters at the primaries, June 4, 1910.

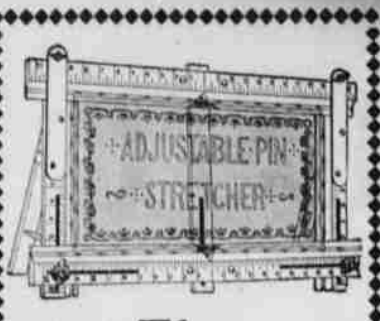
