

RIOTS ON D. & H.

One Killed and Six Injured at Carbon-

Wilkes-Barre, Pa., July 26,-Serious rioting, dynamiting and train wreck ing has occurred along the line of the Delaware & Hudson railread be tween this city and Carbondale on which 1,200 section hands are strik-

ing, in the past 24 hours. la a riot at Carbondale one was kill ed and six injured, the tracks of the railroad beneath the Laurel line viaouct at Avoca were dynamited and blown out while in the railroad yards at Hudson three miles from this city the fish plates on a number of the drawn and the rails replaced so that they were spread two inches wider. Similar work was done in the Carbondale yards and as a result a locomo tives were derailed in each yard and ore serious accidents were narrow-

A mob of about 500 attacked strikebreakers at Carbondale and several hundred shots were fired, the police trying to protect the strikebreakers. In the melce James Cicone was shot through the head and he died later. veral arrests have been made.
