Postal Card Bans are barred. The attorney for the second assistant postmaster general of the United States has ruled that in the future no "dunning" postal cards shall be sent through the mails by public service corporations and delinquent tax collectors.

THE result of the attorney's order will be that all tax notices, gas notices, light notices and telephone notices must be enclosed in an envelope. As the city and county delinquent tax collectors have fee offices, including rent, clerk hire and stationery, this order will mean an additional expense to the collectors for stamps and envelopes.
