New Party Nominates Leaders by Acciamation

"PROGRESSIVE" OFFICIAL TITLE

Payne-Aldrich Tariff Bill Condemned in Platform, Also Canadian Reciprocity and Aldrich Currency Plan.

The Progressive party the official name of the new party adopted by the convention in Chicago, completed Its ticket and nominated:

For president, Theodore Roosevelt f New York

For vice president, Governor Hiram W. Johnson of California,

Both nominations were made by aclamation amid stormy scenes of enthusiasm. The convention had been in session ten hours. The delay in making the nominations was caused by exhaustive discussions over the platform in the committee on resolu-

From the very first moment to the last this convention has had the appearance of a great religious revival. Senator Dixon and others remarked at the close of the convention:

"This is not politics; this religion.

A platform which differs drastically from those adopted at the Republican and Democratic conventions was indorsed by the new Progressive party delegates. It follows in part.

The party declares for direct primaries for the nomination of state and national officers, for nationwide primaries for candidates for the presidency, for the direct election of United States senators by the people, and we urge on the states the policy of the short ballot with responsibility to the people secured by the initiative, referendum and recall.

The party pledges itself to provide a more easy and expeditious method of amending the fundamental consti-Equal suffrage to men and women

The Progressive party, in order to secure to the people a better administration of justice, pledges itself to work unceasingly for the reform of legal procedure and judicial methods. We pledge ourselves to work unceasingly in state and nation for: Legislation looking to the prevenion of industrial accidents, occupational diseases, overwork, involuntary unemployment and other injurious effects incident to modern industry.




