OHIO ELECTIONS. CINCINNATI, Oct. 17.—In Ohio, thirty-one counties give a Democratic majority, of 17,800. The Democratic gain is over 28,000.

NEW YORK, Oct. 17.—A special to the "Express" says: In Ohio thirteen Democrats are certainly elected to Congress out of the nineteen Representatives.
