SEC. 24. And be it further enacted, that every person not subject to the rules and articles of war who shall procure or entice or attempt to procure or entice a soldier in the service of the United States to desert, or who shall harber or conceal, or give employment to a deserter, or carry him away, or aid in carrying him away.
