



And be is further enacted, that every person not subject to the rules and articles of war who shall procure or entice or attempt to procure or entice a soldier in the service of the United States to desert, shall procure or eliter or attempt to proture or enters a soldier in the service of the U-sind states to descrt, or who shall harber or conceal, or give employment to a descrter, or carry him away, or aid in carrying him away, knowing him to be such, or who shall purchase from any soolder his equipment, arms, ammunition, uniform, clothing or any part thereof and any Captain or commanding officer of any ship or vessel, or any conductor or superintendant of any Ratiroad, or any other public conveyance, carrying away any such soldier as one of his crew, or otherwise knowing him to have descrted, or shall refuse to deliver him up to the orders of his commanding officer shall upon legal conviction, be fued, at the discretion of any court having cogaizance of the fact, in any sum not exceeding five hundred doltars, and he shall be imprisoned not exceeding two years nor less than six months.

Enrolling officers and loyal citizens are required to arrest or give information that will lead to the arrest of all persons violating the above section.


