ROASTED ALIVE!

The following record of one day's accidents, all from the same cause, viz: the use of inferior Coal Oil is taken from the Philadelphia Ledger of a recent date: "The alarm of fire, last evening, at 7 o'clock, was caused by the burning of the dwelling, corner of 18th and Poplar, resulting from the explosion of a coal oil lamp. On entering her room, she was found lying on the floor, wrapped in flames. "About 7 o'clock yesterday morning, a coal oil lamp in the hands of Sarah Alexander, who lives on Cowlish St. near 16th—She was severely burned. "Margaret Colligan, residing in the rear of 6th South St., was burned by the explosion of a coal oil lamp. Her husband, while attempting to extinguish the flame, was also severely burned. Two of the above named victims have since died of their injuries. 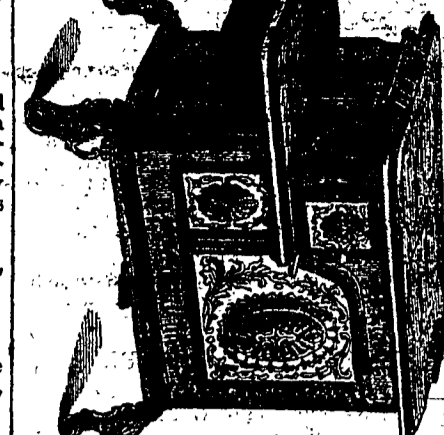
