Destruction of the Town of Daroca, Spain, by a Waterpout. A letter in the Madrid Tribune of Sept. 17th, gives an account of a terrible and extraordinary catastrophe that had occurred at Daroca, a small town in Arragon, situated in a rich and fertile valley, abounding in corn and wine.

It appears that on the 11th September, at three in the afternoon, an immense waterpout, rising from the Lake of Galocatica, remained for a considerable time hovering over the shore, about a league from Daroca.

The gateway, although an unusually large one, was not large enough to allow their entrance, and another great lake was formed against the walls, which presently began to crumble under its pressure.

The Maine Law in Connecticut. We have never witnessed so complete a triumph of the friends of any reform measure, as that of the Maine Law.

We have seen at a single town training, more than two hundred men and boys, crazy drunk. At every election of a new captain, rum was brought out in pairs full-free for the train band and all the spectators to drink as long as they could stand.

On Thursday last we saw the largest company of people together that we ever saw in that State, and we have never seen a better ordered assembly—no drinking, at least in sight, and no one daring favor the practice in secret, to be seen intoxicated in public; and here, we believe, not one was seen.

Similar remarks we heard from all, and that was not a few, that we talked with upon the subject. We could not hear of a single man who would openly advocate the repeal of the law; not even the liquor dealers, who have generally acquiesced in the law without grumbling.

When, ripe in years and experience, Col. Benton deemed it his duty to devote himself to his country rather than his party, where, as the attempt to embroil us in a war with England about Oregon, the lines diverged, the democracy decided that he must be put down.

The first point was to get the veteran out of the Senate, to accomplish which the democracy of Missouri supported the whig candidate. By a union, therefore, of the whigs and anti-Benton democrats in the Missouri legislature upon a whig, Colonel Benton was beaten.

But the electors of the Missouri district, resenting the wrong done to a distinguished statesman, immediately elected him to the House of Representatives, where the country has had the benefit of his talents, courage, firmness, and wisdom through a protracted and eventful session.

But his enemies were at his heels. His exclusion from the House of Representatives was decreed. And in this, Senator Atchison had the assistance of the administration.—Colonel Benton, to aid his enemies, had opposed the Nebraska swindle.

And to avoid against the possibility of Col. Benton's re-election to the Senate, the war upon him is kept up throughout the State; and as a consequence, six whig members of Congress have just been chosen in a State which, until the business of breaking down Col. Benton commenced, had not sent a whig to Congress in a quarter of a century.
