

"The undersigned, members of the committee, do respectfully report, that we saw the two Safes origi-nally agreed upon by Farrels & Heiring and Evans & Watson, placed side by side in a turnace, vizz The Safe in use by the Paymaster of the Philadel-phia and Reading Railroad Company, in his office at Reading, manufactured by Farrels & Herring, and the safe in use by H. A. Lantz, in his store, manufactured by Evans & Watson and put in books

and papers precisely alike.

The fire was started at 83 o'clock, A. M., and kept up until four cords of green hickory, two cords kept up until four cords of green hickory, two cords dry oak and half chestnut top wood were entirely consumed, the whole under the superintendence of the subscribers, members of the Committee.
