A traveler in Siberia during the winter, is so enveloped in furs that he can scarcely move; and under the thick fur hood, which is fastened to the bear skin collar and covers the whole face, one can only draw in as it were by stealth a little of the external air, which is so keen that it causes a very peculiar and painful feeling in the throat and lungs. The distance from one halting place to another takes about ten hours, during which time the traveller must continue on horseback, as the cumbrous dress makes it insupportable to wade through the snow .-The poor horses suffer at least as much as their riders, for besides the general effect of the cold they are tormented by the ice, forming in their nostrils and stopping their breathing. When the icy ground is not covered by snow their hoofs often burst from the effects of the cold. The caravan is also surrounded by a thick cloud of vapor; it is not only living bodies which produce this effect, but even the snow smokes. The evaporations are instantly changed into millions of needles of ice, which fill the air and cause a constant slight noise, resembling the sound of torn silk or satin. Even the reindeer seeks the forest to protect himself from the intensity of the cold. In the Tundras, where there is no shelter to be found, the whole herd crowd together as close as possible to guin a little warmth from each other, and may be seen standing in this way quite motionless. Only the dark bird of winter, the raven, still cleaves the icv air with slow and heavy wing, leaving behind him a lone line of thin vapor; marking the trace of its solitary flight. The thickest trunks of trees are rent asunder with loud sounds, which in these deserts, fall on the ear like the signal gun at sea; large masses of rocks are torn from their ancient sites; the ground in the Tundras and in the Rocky valleys cracks, forming wide yawning fissures, from which the waters which were beneath the surface, rise, giving off a cloud of vapor and become immediately changed into ice.-The effect of this degree of cold extends beyoud the earth. 
