"The undersigned, members of the committee, do "The undersigned, members of the committee, do respectfully report, that we suw the two Safes origi-nally agreed upon by Farrels & Herring and Evans & Watson, placed side by side in a turnece, viz: The Safe in use by the Paymaster of the Philadel-phia and Reading Railroad Company, in his office at Reading, manufactured by Farrels & Herring, and the safe in use by H. A. Lantz, in his store, manufactured by Evans & Watson, and put in books and papers precisely alike. The fire was started at 8½ oclock, A. M., and heat un until four cords of preen hickory, two cords

kept up until four cords of green hickory; two cords dry oak and half chestnut top wood were entirely consumed, the whole under the superintendence of the subscribers, members of the Committee. The Safes were then cooled off with water, after which they were opened and the books and papers taken out by the Committee and sent to H. A. Laniz's out by the Committee and sent to H. A. Lantz's store for public examination, after they were first examined and marked by the Committee. 


