On the other hand, should the constitutional party prevail, and their authority be established over the republic, there is reason to hope that they will be animated by a less friendly spirit, and may grant that redress to American citizens, which justice requires to be given to them by the means.

DEBT AND CREDIT. The report of the Secretary of the Treasury will explain in detail the operations of that department of the government. The receipts into the treasury from all sources during the fiscal year ending 30th June, 1858, including the treasury notes authorized by the act of December 23, 1857, were \$70,973,569.59, which amount, with the balance of \$17,710,114.27 remaining in the treasury at the commencement of the year, made an aggregate for the service of the year of \$88,683,683.86.
