

PENNSYLVANIA. HER MILITARY FORCE AND ARMS.

From an official source, we learn that the whole number of organized volunteer companies in this State is about 500, averaging about 40 men to each company, making an aggregate of over 20,000 uniformed volunteers.

The balance of the State is about 355,000 men capable of military duty. The arms of the State are all in the possession of the volunteer companies 12,080 muskets, 4,706 rifles, 2,809 cavalry swords and sabres, 3,147 pistols, 69 pieces of ordnance being six pound bronze cannon.

In reference to requisitions being made upon the Governor for troops, the 6th section of the militia law of April 24, 1832, which is still in force, provides that when the President of the United States shall have made a requisition of a part of the militia of this State for public service, the Adjutant General shall take the most prompt and efficacious measures for detaching and supplying with all necessary arms, equipments, ammunitions and provisions, the number of men required, and for having them marched to the place of rendezvous.
