TREATMENT OF CROUP.--- Credip is an inflam-mation of the inner surface of the windpipe. Inflammation implies heat, and that heat must be subdued or the patient will inevitably die. If prompt efforts are made to cool the parts in case of an attack of croup, relief will be as prompt as it is surprising and delightful. All know that cold water applied to a hot skin cools it, but all do not know and understand that hot water applied to an inflamed skin will as certainly cool it off. Hence, the application of cold water with livin clens, or of almost boiling water with woolen, fignel, are very efficient in the cure of croup. Take two or three pieces of woolen flamed with foods, large enough to cover the threat and upper part of the chest; put these in a per of water as hot as the hand can bear, and keep it thus, hot, by adding water from a boiling ted-kettle at hand ; let two of the flannels be in hot water all the time, and one on the throatfail the time, with a dry flannel covering the web one, the fisnnels should be so wet, when put on, as to dribble the water. As soon as one figurel gets a little cool put on another hot and with as little in tervals of exposure as possible, and keep up this process until the doi tor comes, or until the phlegm is loose, and the child is easier, and begins to fall asleep; then gintly wrap a dry flannel over the wet one, and the child is saved. When it wakes up both flankels will be dry,-Hall's Journal of Health.
