In a few instances more, valuetle time is lost to the school ten times over, then the cost of getting wood, Wood furnished by district funds, taxes all alike ; if left to voluntary donations

the whole burden fulls upon the willing few. 11. Will Directors be so sind as to see that the Teacher's Blank Report books are distributed at the commencement of school. In a few instances, Boards have a firely neglected to furnish the books during the term. This is a great neglect of official dury.

12. It is not legal nor allo vable for a Board of Directors to delegate the asthority of hiring a teacher to some person not a Director; neither should one Director hire teacher or teacl ers unless such action be i feedily sanctioned by a majority of the Board. No director or directors less than a majority this make a valid contract.


